The Secretariat of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) presents its compliments to the IAEA's Member States and has the honour to draw their attention to the **Workshop for Radiation Safety Information Management System Coordinators** (hereinafter referred to as "event") to be held at the IAEA's Headquarters in Vienna, Austria, from **1 to 5 June 2026**.

Radiation Safety Information Management System (RASIMS) is a web-based collaborative platform that provides Member States and the IAEA with a framework for collecting and analyzing information related to the status of their national infrastructure for radiation, transport and waste safety.

The purpose of the event is to present features of RASIMS and to assist RASIMS national coordinators in collecting relevant information and ensuring that the information in RASIMS is accurate, comprehensive and up to date.

The attached Information Sheet provides further details of the event.

The event will be held in English.

The event is intended for the officially appointed RASIMS National Coordinator. If the National Coordinator is unavailable, another individual who is actively involved in the use of RASIMS and supports or works closely with the National Coordinator may be designated to attend instead.

The IAEA is generally not in a position to bear the travel and other costs of participants in the event. The IAEA has, however, limited funds at its disposal to help meet the cost of attendance of certain participants. Upon specific request, such assistance may be offered to normally one participant per country, provided that, in the IAEA's view, the participant will make an important contribution to the event. The application for financial support should be made via the InTouch+ platform not later than **30 April 2026**, as indicated in the enclosed Information Sheet.

It should be noted that compensation is not payable by the IAEA for any damage to or loss of personal property. The IAEA also does not provide health insurance coverage for participants in IAEA events. Arrangements for private insurance coverage on an individual basis should therefore be made. The IAEA will, however, provide insurance coverage for accidents and illnesses that clearly result from any work performed for the IAEA.

Designations should be submitted to the IAEA via the InTouch+ platform (<https://intouchplus.iaea.org>)

through the competent national authority (Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Permanent Mission to the IAEA or National Atomic Energy Authority) not later than **30 April 2026**, as indicated in the enclosed Information Sheet.

The Scientific Secretary of the event will liaise with the participants directly concerning further arrangements, including travel details, as appropriate, once the official designations have been received.

The Secretariat of the International Atomic Energy Agency avails itself of this opportunity to renew to the IAEA's Member States the assurances of its highest consideration.
