The Secretariat of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) presents its compliments to the IAEA's Member States and has the honour to draw their attention to the **Second Meeting of Legal and Technical Experts on the Need for Revision of the Nuclear Security Fundamentals** (hereinafter referred to as "event") to be held at the IAEA's Headquarters in Vienna, Austria, from **19 to 21 December 2022**.

In addition, the event will allow for virtual participation via Cisco WebEx.

The purpose of the event is to gather feedback and perspectives from a broad range of Member States regarding the need for and implications of the revision, in the near term, of "Objective and Essential Elements of a State's Nuclear Security Regime" (IAEA Nuclear Security Series No. 20). The event will build on the discussions held during the initial Technical Meeting on this topic in January 2022, as well as on the results of a questionnaire distributed to all Member States in June 2022. Member States' views on the feasibility of undertaking such a revision, as well as its possible scope, will be important topics of discussion.

The attached Information Sheet provides further details of the event.

The event will be held in English.

Member States are invited to designate one or more participants to represent the Government at this event. Member States are strongly encouraged to identify women participants.

The IAEA is generally not in a position to bear the travel and other costs of participants in the event. The IAEA has, however, limited funds at its disposal to help meet the cost of attendance of certain participants. Upon specific request, such assistance may be offered to normally one participant per country, provided that, in the IAEA's view, the participant will make an important contribution to the event. The application for financial support should be made at the time of designating the participants using the attached Grant Application Form (Form C).

It should be noted that compensation is not payable by the IAEA for any damage to or loss of personal property. The IAEA also does not provide health insurance coverage for participants in IAEA events. Arrangements for private insurance coverage on an individual basis should therefore be made. The IAEA will, however, provide insurance coverage for accidents and illnesses that clearly result from any work performed for the IAEA.

Designations should be submitted to the IAEA through the competent national authority (Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Permanent Mission to the IAEA or National Atomic Energy Authority) not later than **10 October 2022** using the attached Participation Form (Form A). Introduction

A need has been identified for a limited-scope revision of the second tier of Nuclear Security Series (NSS) Guidance, the Recommendations, in the near term. This has raised the question of whether or not the top tier of NSS Guidance, the Objective and Essential Elements of a State's Nuclear Security Regime (NSS No. 20) should be concurrently revised alongside the Recommendations. Due to possible implications for Member States associated with a revision of this publication, the Secretariat would like to consult broadly with Member States about this topic.

Objectives

This meeting will seek to provide consensus recommendations from Member States to the Secretariat regarding the need for a revision of the Objective and Essential Elements of a State's Nuclear Security Regime (NSS No. 20) in the near term.

Target Audience

High-level Member State representatives with expertise in broad, high-level legal and regulatory matters related to nuclear security, as well as, secondarily, technical matters pertaining to the implementation of NSS No. 20.

Working Language(s)

English

Participation and Registration

All persons wishing to participate in the event have to be designated by an IAEA Member State or should be members of organizations that have been invited to attend.

In order to be designated by an IAEA Member State, participants are requested to send the **Participation Form (Form A)** to their competent national authority (e.g. Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Permanent Mission to the IAEA or National Atomic Energy Authority) for onward transmission to the IAEA by **10 October 2022**. Venue

The event will be held at the Vienna International Centre (VIC) where the IAEA's Headquarters are located. Participants must make their own travel and accommodation arrangements.

Participants are advised to arrive at Checkpoint 1/Gate 1 of the VIC one hour before the start of the event on the first day in order to allow for timely registration. Participants will need to present an official photo identification document in order to be admitted to the VIC premises.

Visas

Participants who require a visa to enter Austria should submit the necessary application to the nearest diplomatic or consular representative of Austria at least four weeks before they travel to Austria. Since Austria is a Schengen State, persons requiring a visa will have to apply for a Schengen visa. In States where Austria has no diplomatic mission, visas can be obtained from the consular authority of a Schengen Partner State representing Austria in the country in question.
