Introduction

Decommissioning of small facilities was not systematically addressed at an international level in the past. The IAEA launched the International Project on Decommissioning of Medical, Industrial and Research Facilities (MIRDEC) at the 1st TM held in June 2018, when the relevant experiences from MS were presented and discussed, and the needs for assistance and cooperation analysed. In 2019 one meeting of the MIRDEC Coordination Group was held. The 2nd TM was held in February 2020, which included parallel sessions of the 5 Working Groups and 1-day workshop on characterization for decommissioning purposes. The 3rd TM was held in May 2021, which included parallel sessions of the 5 Working Groups and 1-day workshop on clearance of radioactive materials and waste from the regulatory control. The 4th TM was held in November 2021, which included parallel sessions of the 5 Working Groups and 1-day workshop on safety-related documentation for decommissioning. The 5th TM was held in May 2022 in Brussels, Belgium, and included two site visits to the facilities in Belgium that are under decommissioning or planned to be decommissioned, as well as parallel sessions of the 5 Working Groups. The 6th TM was held in March 2023 in Cairo, Egypt, and included site visit to the Egyptian Iron and Steel Company, where decommissioning activities of source-based facilities were

carried out. This TM is the seventh Technical Meeting of the project and will focus on preparation of case studies on decommissioning of different types of small facilities that are of primary interest to the MS, as well as on development of draft project report. The meeting will also include site visit to the nuclear facilities at Risø operated by Danish Decommissioning.

Objectives

The objective of the Seventh Technical Meeting is to further advance discussions, exchange of experiences and good practices, development of case studies and draft decommissioning plans for selected types of small facilities, as well as showing practical examples of decommissioning during site visits.

Target Audience

The candidates to be nominated should be professionals from national authorities, policy making organizations, regulatory bodies, decommissioning licensee organizations, technical support organizations and service providers that are or will be involved in the planning, implementation or regulatory control of decommissioning of medical, industrial and research facilities. Strong preference will be given to participants who attended the previous project meetings.

Participation and Registration

Papers and Presentations

The IAEA encourages participants to give presentations on the work of their respective institutions that falls under the topics listed in above Topics Section.

Participants who wish to give presentations are requested to submit an abstract of their work. The abstract will be reviewed as part of the selection process for presentations. The abstract should be in A4 page format, should extend to no more than pages (including figures and tables) and should not exceed words. It should be sent electronically to Mr Oleksii Tokarevskyi, the Scientific Secretary of the event (see contact details in below Visas Section), not later than . Authors will be notified of the acceptance of their proposed presentations by .

In addition, participants have to submit the abstract together with the **Participation Form (Form A)** to their competent national authority (e.g. Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Permanent Mission to the IAEA or National Atomic Energy Authority) or their organization for onward transmission to the IAEA not later than .

Expenditures and Grants

No registration fee is charged to participants.

The IAEA is generally not in a position to bear the travel and other costs of participants in the event. The IAEA has, however, limited funds at its disposal to help meet the cost of attendance of certain participants. Upon specific request, such assistance may be offered to normally one participant per country, provided that, in the IAEA's view, the participant will make an important contribution to the event.

The application for financial support should be made using the **Grant Application Form (Form C)** which has to be stamped, signed and submitted by the competent national authority to the IAEA together with the **Participation Form (Form A)** by **4 July 2022**.
